All about the ACC

Lawns-

Now is a good time to kill the crabgrass in your lawn so you can seed after the crabgrass is dead. Then be sure to use a pre-emergent next year to thwart the problem before it really starts. Fall is also a good time to kill the contaminating grasses in your lawn. The Bermuda will turn brown in the fall so it's easily spotted and removed. Then, you can seed with fescue. Likewise, the fescue will stay green in your Bermuda.
